

Connecticut Homeschool Graduation Requirements

At a glance · facts last reviewed August 28, 2026

State notification	None required by statute. District notice-of-intent forms are a courtesy, and filing is voluntary
Legal basis	The equivalent instruction clause of CGS 10-184. Connecticut has no homeschool statute at all
Required subjects	Reading, writing, spelling, English grammar, geography, arithmetic, US history, and citizenship
Testing / evaluation	None. No testing, portfolio review, or records submission is required
Recordkeeping	Nothing is submitted; a portfolio and attendance log are state recommendations, not law
Graduation requirements	None for home instruction. Districts do not convert grades 9 to 12 work into public credit
Who issues the diploma	The parent, in the name of the family's program, signed as administrator. The state offers none
College admissions	UConn asks homeschoolers for a transcript plus a comprehensive curriculum outline with syllabi or logs
Compulsory attendance ages	5 to 18, with opt-outs available until age 6 or 7
