

Kansas Homeschool Graduation Requirements

State notification	One-time registration of the school name and address with KSDE (K.S.A. 72-4346). No fee, no approval, no renewal
Legal basis	The homeschool operates as a nonaccredited private school taught by a competent instructor (K.S.A. 72-3120)
Required subjects	None named in law. Curriculum is the family's responsibility, with the state standards as an optional reference
Instructional time	KSDE reads substantially equivalent as 186 days of six hours, or 1,116 hours a year, grades one to eleven
Testing / evaluation	None. No testing, and no records, attendance, or curriculum are submitted to anyone
Graduation requirements	None. The parent decides completion, and KSDE says the school must issue its own diplomas
Who issues the diploma	The parent, as official custodian of the registered nonaccredited private school, in the school's name
College admissions	Regents qualified admissions: precollege curriculum with a 2.0 GPA plus ACT 21, SAT 1060, or top-third rank
Compulsory attendance ages	7 until 18, with an opt-out at 16 or 17 requiring written parental consent (K.S.A. 72-3120)
