

Minnesota Homeschool Graduation Requirements

At a glance · facts last reviewed August 28, 2026

State notification	Initial Registration Form by October 1, then a Letter of Intent to Continue each October 1
Legal basis	Minnesota Statutes 120A.22 and 120A.24. Being the child's parent is itself a qualifying teaching credential
Required subjects	Communication skills, literature and fine arts, math and science, social studies, health and physical education
Annual assessment	A nationally norm-referenced achievement test each year, on an exam the superintendent and parent agree on
Recordkeeping	Keep class schedules, copies of instructional materials, and descriptions of assessment methods
Graduation requirements	None. Instruction is required through age 17 unless the child has graduated, and the parent decides
Who issues the diploma	The parent, in the name of the family's school, supported by the transcript and required documentation
Dual enrollment	PSEO covers college tuition, textbooks, and materials in grades 10 to 12 if registration stays current
Compulsory attendance ages	7 through 17, unless the student has graduated
