| <b>State notification</b>         | None. No registration with or approval from state or local officials is required                |
| <b>Legal basis</b>                | Other means of education under Oklahoma Constitution Article XIII, Section 4 and 70 O.S. 10-105 |
| <b>Program length</b>             | Instruction must run the full term the schools of the district are in session                   |
| <b>Testing / evaluation</b>       | None. No state testing, and no official may visit or inspect the home                           |
| <b>Recordkeeping</b>              | Nothing is submitted to the state, ever; attendance notes and course lists are the family's own |
| <b>Graduation requirements</b>    | None prescribed. The parent operating the program decides when high school is complete          |
| <b>Who issues the diploma</b>     | The parent, signing as administrator; no agency can verify or certify a homeschool graduation   |
| <b>College admissions</b>         | Oklahoma's Promise asks homeschoolers for an ACT 22 or equivalent plus a 2.50 core GPA          |
| <b>Compulsory attendance ages</b> | Over 5 and under 18 (70 O.S. 10-105)                                                            |
