

Vermont Homeschool Graduation Requirements

At a glance · facts last reviewed August 28, 2026

State notification	Enrollment notice to the Agency of Education 10 business days before starting, then a yearly notice
Legal basis	Home study under 16 V.S.A. 166b, substantially simplified by Act 66 of 2023
Required subjects	The minimum course of study in 16 V.S.A. 906; the four core fields for students 13 and older
Annual assessment	Year-end assessment by one of five means: test, certified-teacher review, portfolio, grades, or GED
Recordkeeping	Parent attests to 175 days of instruction a year and keeps the assessment records at home
Graduation requirements	None set by the state; the parent decides when the program is complete
Who issues the diploma	The parent, signing in the name of the family's program; the Agency certifies no completion
College admissions	UVM is test-optional and takes a parent-prepared transcript plus a recommendation letter
Compulsory attendance ages	6 to 16, ending early for a child who has completed the tenth grade
